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Amalfi, Capri, Positano, and Ravello

To state the obvious, Italy's Amalfi Coast is as beautiful as any stretch of coastline in the world, 30 miles of rippling inlets and bays that include the island of Capri and its extraordinary Blue Grotto. With miles of rugged shorelines, sheltered beaches, and charming fishing villages, it's hard to imagine a destination more inviting than the Amalfi Coast. Just like the rest of Italy, the foods and wines of this region are the icing on a very rich cake, with seafood treats such as lobster and crab abounding, and fine wines produced in the area's many terraced vineyards. This tour shows you the best of the Amalfi Coast. We begin in Sorrento a coastal town wonderfully located over white steep cliffs with fantastic views over the Bay of Naples. We explore the ruins of Pompeii in the company of an Italian guide. On the island of Capri we duck our heads as our rowboat slips into the Blue Grotto, a sea cave of luminous blue light. We stay in Positano, a spectacular coastal village clinging to a steep hillside. Later we move to Ravello, a hilltown known for its ravishing gardens and stupendous views. We finish our tour by hiking the Sentiero degli Dei (the Path of the Gods), a breathtaking mountain path with views that stretch the length of the Amalfi Coast.

Route Rating

Moderate: 1-5 miles (2-7 km) per day of hiking with some steep ascents/descents.

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Day 1 Sorrento

Nerone to Punta Penna

2.2 miles (3.6 kilometers)

We meet at our Sorrento hotel in the morning and shuttle 30 minutes to the village of Nerone. A coastal path leads to the Punto Penna headland where the trail spits. To the left is a 14th century watch tower built to guard against attacks from the sea. To the right is the small pebble beach where you swim in the warm waters directly opposite the island of Capri. We stop in Marina del Cantone for lunch. The restaurant sits on a pier jutting out over a black pebble beach. Despite being on the radar of A-list celebrities, little Marina del Cantone still has an unpretentious feel.

Sorrento (2 nights)
This family-run hotel has spacious rooms many with views sea and the Vesuvius volcano. The hotel is outside of the busy town center making it peaceful and quiet. www.ilnido.net

The Hike, Day 1

Ieranto Bay Loop

2.2 miles (3.6 km)
We hike down to an isolated beach. Along the way we pass a 14th century stone fortress. Bring your bathing suit for a dip in the Mediterranean.

Travel Logistics

Tour Start

We suggest you stay in Rome the night before the tour starts. On the morning of Day 1 you can travel from Rome to Sorrento by train. Travel time is about 3 hours.

Tour End

The tour ends in Ravallo. You can take a taxi or public bus from Ravello to the Salerno train station. Fast trains make the trip from Salerno to Rome in 2 hours.

Day 2 Capri Island

Monte Solaro Hike 1.1 mile (1.8 km)

Optional Natural Arch Hike 2.2 miles (3.6 km)

A high speed hydrofoil whisks us to the island of Capri. A resort since Roman times, the island has rugged seascapes, breathtaking views, and chic cafés. Arriving in Marina Grande we transfer to a smaller boat for the coastal run to the Blue Grotto. At the grotto we transfer again to row boats small enough to squeeze through the cave's tiny entrance. With the sea bobbing gently up and down, the oarsman has to time his entrance to get us safely through. With a firm pull on a chain we shoot through the opening and are inside. We find ourselves in a large sea cave suspended above translucent blue waters. The oarsman belt out Neopolitan songs, drowning each other out in a cacophony of sound. It is corny, but breathtakingly beautiful. After the grotto we take a chairlift up Monte Solare, Capri's highest hill. We tour a villa beautifully restored by an eccentric Swedish physician in the early 20th century. The villa is bursting with art and artifacts including an Egyptian sphynx. We visit Capri's famous Piazzetta, a well known celebrity retreat. Time and energy permitting we hike to the Arco Naturale (Natural Arch) and later admire incredible views of the Faraglioni rocks. Dinner on your own in Sorrento.

Monte Solaro


1.1 mile (1.8 km)
A chairlift takes us to the summit of Monte Solare and we hike down.

Optional Natural Arch 2.2 miles (3.6 km)
If you want to hike more we can walk to the Natural Arch and Cave of Matermania.

Day 3 **Pompeii**

Pompeii Guided Tour

We shuttle 45 minutes to Pompeii where we have an appointment with a local Italian guide. Pompeii is more than an archeological site. It is a city, chock-a-block with homes, business, and public spaces. We visit 2,000-year-old seaside estates strolling past living rooms, bedrooms, and kitchens, many with their original frescoed walls. Pompeii's streets still show the grooves carved by the passage of chariot wheels. We visit public baths and a brothel. We see the plaster casts of those who died. In one villa we see the casts of thieves, surrounded by their booty. They broke in during the eruption, but were buried by falling ash before they could escape. We have lunch in Pompeii before starting a scenic coastal drive to Positano, the Amalfi Coast's most picturesque and photogenic town. The town is a maze of steep streets lined with stylish boutiques, trendy restaurants, and small hotels. Hotel in Positano.

Day 4 Ravello

Ravello to Amalfi and Atrani

4.6 miles (7.4 kilometers)

The road that connects the towns of the Amalfi coast is an attraction in and of itself. It is one of the most scenic coastal roads in the world. Challenging for drivers but delightful for passengers, the Amalfi drive is a narrow road that threads along the cliffs high above the Tyrrhenian Sea. A one-hour drive on this road takes us to Ravello, a town perched 1,000 feet above the sea. Ravello's location, well away from the main road, makes it the most peaceful and charming resort on the Neapolitan Riviera. We stop at a mom and pop minimarket for picnic supplies before starting a gorgeous coastal hike. We hike to a national park and admire spring-fed waterfalls. Following the water downhill, we descend through a verdant valley. We pass the ruins of ancient paper mills before arriving the in the picturesque coastal town of Amalfi. Dinner on your own in Ravello.

Ravello (2 nights) The Hotel Parsifal is located in a former convent that dates to 1288. Many rooms have spectacular coastal views.

The Hike, Day 4

Valley of the Mills 4.6 miles (7.4 km) We hike through lemon groves before arriving at spring fed waterfalls. Following the stream downhill, we pass ancient paper mills and arrive in the town of Amalfi.



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Day 5 Path of the Gods

Ravello to Pontone

3.3 miles (5.4 kilometers)

The Amalfi Coast is one of the world's greatest drives, not surprisingly the paths above it are among the world's greatest hikes. The Sentiero degli Dei (*Path of the Gods*) is a relatively gentle path that hugs the cliffs of the coast while commanding astonishing sea and mountain views. The panoramas are inspiring, shimmering light combined with an exhilarating land-scape. High above the azure waters we can see the length of the Amalfi Coast all the way to the island of Capri. We hear the tingling bells of goats grazing on the steep hills. We pass isolated farms, sheer cliffs, vertical vineyards and terraces. Lemons and wildflowers scent the air. This is the best hike in Amalfi and one of the best in Italy. Before dinner visit a historic villa in Ravello for more spectacular sea views. Group dinner in Ravello (included in tour price).

Day 6 Hiking Tour Ends

Your walking tour ends in Ravallo. On the last day we will shuttle you to the Napoli train station (1.5-hour drive). There is a fast train every hour from Naples to Rome. The train ride takes a little over one hour. We will be happy to assist you with your post tour travel plans.

The Hike, Day 5

Path of the Gods
3.3 miles (5.4 km)
We hike the Path of the Gods (Sentiro degli Dei),
Amalfi's most famous trail. We drive to Bomerano to start the hike, avoiding a big hill.

Ravello has two gorgeous villas open to the public.

Villa Cimbrone

Villa Cimbrone has a panoramic terrace with the best views over the Amalfi Coast.

Villa Rufolo

Right off the main square the property has a 14th Century villa and amazing coastal views.
